Requirements:

\*1.Go to an Israeli news website, such as <http://www.haaretz.co.il/> or <http://news.walla.co.il/>. 2.Set a timer for 25 minutes; 3.copy a sentence by hand [**skip the author's byline!**]; 4.write the definition **over** each word; 5.write a translation of the whole sentence **beneath**; 6.ask the Internet for a translation and rewrite your translation at the **bottom**, correcting as necessary (do not simply reproduce the Internet translation!). 7.List new vocabulary items and their definition; 8.Repeat until timer sounds. (You're on your honor here.) Repeat 3x weekly, submitting the work in class.
